

The Wedding at Cana, Galilee

John 2, 1-10

And the third day there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee; and the mother of Jesus was there:

And both Jesus was called, and his disciples, to the marriage.

And when they wanted wine, the mother of Jesus sayeth unto him, "They have no wine."

Jesus saith unto her, "Woman, what have I to do with thee? mine hour is not yet come."

His mother saith unto the servants,
"Whatever he saith unto you, do *it*."

And there were set there six waterpots of stone, after the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three firkins apiece.

Jesus saith unto them,
"Fill the waterpots with water."

And they filled them to the brim.

And he saith unto them,
"Draw out now, and bear unto the governor of the feast."
And they bare *it*.

When the ruler of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and knew not whence it was: (but the servants who drew the water knew ;) the governor of the feast called the BRIDEGROOM, and saith unto him,

"Every man at the beginning doth set forth good wine; and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: *but* thou hast kept the good wine until now."

Note: A Firkin is a measure of liquid equaling 7.5 gallons or 38 (750 ml) bottles of wine.

With just 2 firkins in each jar; conservatively, over 450 bottles of wine were miraculously produced.
